ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance at school is mandatory. When a child misses school, they greatly disrupt their learning. It is not okay for students to miss school because it is their birthday or because you are going shopping or because Dad is home from working away or you are going on a holiday during the school term. The Department of Education has strong expectations of regular attendance of all our students.

<u>Interesting Fact</u> – if a child misses one day a fortnight of school from pre-primary to year 10, they will miss almost one year of schooling. If a child misses one day a week of school (from pre-primary to year 10), they will miss almost one year of school.

Remember... "It is Not Okay to Stay Away".

IMMUNISATION UPDATE

On 22 July 2019, changes to the *Public Health Act 2016* (WA) and the *School Education Act 1999* (WA), came into effect that will better protect young and vulnerable WA children and the wider community from vaccine-preventable diseases. Under these new changes, the



child's immunisation status must be 'up-to-date' according to their AIR Immunisation History Statement to be permitted to enrol into long day care, family day care, pre-kindergarten or kindergarten. Exceptions apply to children who have an approved medical exemption to a vaccine, have natural immunity to a specific disease, are on an approved catch-up schedule, or are identified as an exempt child because of a particular family circumstance.

As of 22 July 2019, if enrolment of a child in 2019 or 2020 has already been finalised, the enrolment is not impacted by this new legislation. Where an application for enrolment has not been accepted and/or finalised, the new immunisation requirements must be met. Students enrolled at the same school for the remainder of 2019 are not affected by the changes. More information is attached to this newsletter or here https://www.healthywa.wa.gov.au/immunisation.

VACATION SWIMMING (VACSWIM)

With swimming pools and beaches a big part of the Western Australian lifestyle, ensuring your children can swim competently and safely is essential. You can now enrol your children in VacSwim swimming lessons during the October and December/January school holidays.

VacSwim offers swimming lessons for children aged five to 17 years during the October school holidays. Your children can join in the fun of learning to swim at pools and open water venues across the State. Enrol your children in VacSwim now at education.wa.edu.au/swimming



COLDS AND FLU

Colds and flu (influenza) are most common in the winter months. They are highly contagious and are spread by coughing, sneezing and touching. Cold and Flu are two different illnesses caused by different *PAP* ent viruses. Colds are caused by 200 different viruses with symptoms including coughing, fever, sore throat, sneezing, and a blocked or runny nose. The Flu is caused by a different group of viruses and it is much more severe. Common symptoms include fever, sore throat, tiredness and muscle aches.



Some ways to protect your children and family from colds and flus this winter include:

- Getting the influenza vaccination. Flu viruses circulating in the community continually change, and immunity for the vaccine does not last a long time so it is recommended you get vaccinated each year.
- Eating nutritious foods such as fruit and vegetables to boost their general health.
- Teaching your child how to wash their hands thoroughly and often. We should wash our hands for at least 20 seconds, especially after coughing, sneezing or blowing your nose.
- Teaching your children to sneeze into their elbow instead of their hands.
- Only use tissues once and throw them away after they are used, then wash hands.
- Keeping children away from people who are infected, and keep children away home from school if they show symptoms of a cold or flu.

2020 APPLICATIONS

In Western Australia, children can start their education in Kindergarten, however compulsory schooling starts the following year in Pre-primary. All children of compulsory school age must be enrolled in school and attend every day – this is the law.

You need to apply to enrol your children in school for 2020 if they are:

- starting Kindergarten 4 years old by 30 June 2020
- starting Pre-primary, the first year of compulsory school 5 years old by 30 June 2020
- starting Year 7, the first year of secondary school
- changing schools.

The closing date for all Applications was Friday, 26 July 2019. Please note Applications for Enrolment are not to be confused with Enrolments. All applicants will be contacted shortly after closing date advising if their application has been successful and invite them to return and complete enrolment forms.
