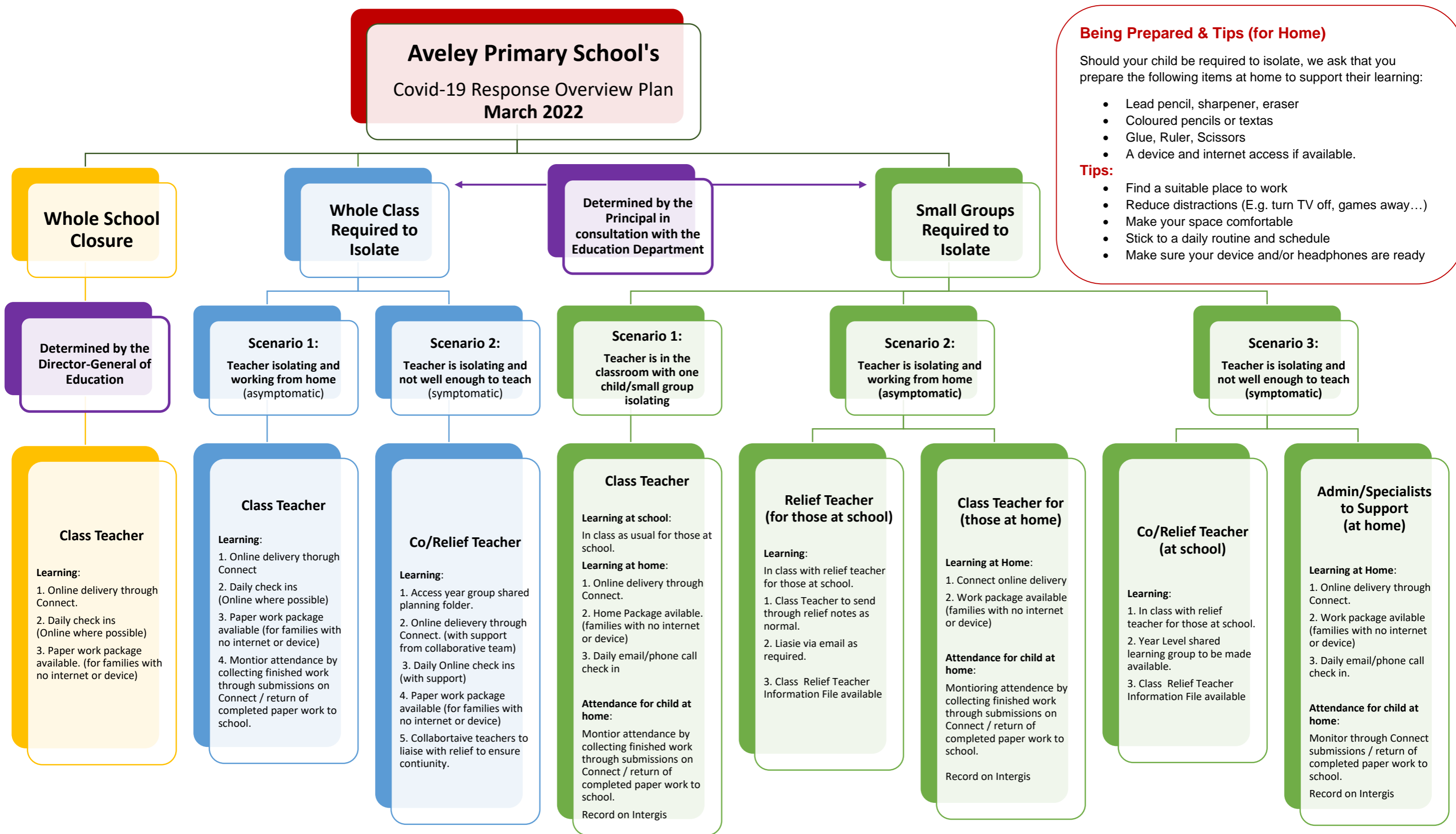

Whole School Closure

The classroom teacher will deliver through Connect, a suggested online learning timetable and lesson content. Students isolating with no internet/device access will have a paper work package available from administration.

Whole Class Required to Isolate

Scenario 1: Teacher Is Isolating and Working from Home (Asymptomatic)

- If the teacher is isolating and working from home, the whole class will participate in online learning using Connect and Webex/Teams
- Students isolating with no internet/device access will have a paper work package available from administration.
- Class teachers will communicate to ensure everything is up and running with Connect.
- Administration communication notices will be via Connect.
- Your teacher will make contact through Connect to provide you with a timetable, lessons, and resources to start learning from home. Please note: Timetables & lessons will be different for different year levels.
- Teachers will endeavour to schedule and check in with children for a social check as a whole class or small groups of children daily using Webex/Teams (face to face) where possible. Our best intentions are to check in online, however this may not always be possible.

Scenario 2: Teacher Is Isolating and Not Well Enough to Teach (Symptomatic)

- If the teacher is isolating and not well, a relief teacher will be employed and the whole class will participate in online learning using Connect. Each class teacher will have information for a relief teacher.
- Students isolating with no internet/device access will have a paper work package made available from administration.
- The relief teacher will make contact through Connect with a timetable and lesson content for online learning.
- The relief teacher or member of administration will endeavour to schedule and check in with children for a social check as a whole class or small groups of children daily using WebEx/Teams (face to face) where possible. Our best intentions are to check in online, however this may not always be possible.
- A member of administration or Specialist Teacher will provide further support for the relief teacher.

Small Groups Required to Isolate

Scenario 1: Teacher Is in The Classroom with Some Children Isolating

- If the teacher is at school, they will be teaching the remaining students face-to-face as per the usual school day.
- Students isolating at home will be provided with learning from home lessons. Students will need to access this content via Connect.
- Students isolating with no internet/device access will have a paper work package available from administration.
- To check how a student is going, the teacher will email, direct message on Connect or phone to answer any questions when possible.

Scenario 2: Teacher Is Isolating and Working from Home (Asymptomatic)

- If the teacher is isolating and working from home and is well enough to teach, the teacher will focus on teaching those students who are also isolating at home and well enough to participate.
- To check how a student is going, the teacher will email, direct message on Connect or phone to answer any questions when possible.
- Students isolating at home will be provided with learning from home lessons. Students will need to access this content via Connect.
- Students isolating with no internet/device access will have a paper work package available from administration.
- A relief teacher will be employed to teach face-to-face the students who remain in the classroom. A co-year level teacher or a Deputy Principal will assist.

Scenario 3: Teacher Is Isolating and Not Well Enough to Teach (Symptomatic)

- If the teacher is isolating and not well, a relief teacher will be employed to teach the students who remain in the classroom. A collaborative year level teacher or Deputy Principal will assist where possible.
- Students isolating at home will be provided with learning from home lessons. Students will need to access this content via Connect.
- Students isolating with no internet/device access will have a paper work package available from administration.
- The Administration Team and/or Specialist Teacher (if required) will call students isolating to check in and answer any questions.
- A Deputy Principal will provide further support for the relief teacher.

Home Learning Package Pick Up (Delivery - if required)

Families who don't have access to the internet or device to access Connect will be able to pick up a paperwork package from administration. If no one is able to collect the package, please contact the school office to arrange delivery.

The school and class teachers have a record of families requiring home packages – based on responses to our ICT survey completed by families in the first few weeks of school.

If your family circumstances should change for online delivery, parents/carers must contact the class teacher.

My child is isolating, is in good health and can complete their school work

The teacher will presume your child is well and participating in learning each day. They will monitor attendance through submissions made on Connect or completed paper copies returned to school.

If symptoms develop and your child can not participate, please inform the school immediately via email. If children are unwell they are not expected to complete learning from home and will be marked as unwell.

During this time, please email the absence notice to: aveley.PS@education.wa.edu.au

My child is isolating, is unwell or has a positive COVID test

When students are unwell, they are not expected to complete any learning from home.

During this time, please email the absence notice to Aveley.PS@education.wa.edu.au, preferably before 9 am.

We will mark them as unwell for the entire 7-day isolation period. However, when they are well enough to resume learning from home, please contact the school so we can change their attendance code.

What materials will my child require at home?

Materials required for home learning:

- Lead pencil, sharpener, eraser
- Coloured pencils or textas
- Glue, Ruler, Scissors
- A device with internet access if available

Teachers (where applicable) will ask students to submit work online through Connect. Teachers will mark and provide feedback via Connect.
