School Review – 29.05.2023

Term 2

We are now halfway through term Two.

- Installation of solar panels is underway.
- School has received a \$25 000 grant to cover the cost of supply and install an industrial roof fan into the Undercover Area with the balance going toward replacement of soft fall around the cube and senior playground.
- Wakakirri rehearsals are well underway.
- Learner dispositions – student survey is well under way. Feedback from families is the next stage before these are finalised.
- Term 2 Clubs have been finalised. These include; Running, Drumming, Numero and Athletics Clubs.

Staffing

There will be some changes with school staffing moving into Term Three. We will farewell:

- Mr Julien Coci, moving to another school as Deputy Principal.
- Mrs Symone Florian, heading to a non-government school, and
- Mrs Vicky Lade, who has completed her 6 month contract as will be travelling with her family.

Staffing processes are currently underway to fill these positions.

Speech Therapist

As a trial, our school has accessed the support of a Speech Therapist (Jessica Clark) for one day a week this term and moving to two days a week early next term. Jessica's key role to upskill school staff and work with our school community to identify students requiring speech, language and literacy support. Jess will commence her role prioritising working with Kindergarten & Pre-Primary Staff and Students.

Turf Upgrade

The upgraded turf area has now been handed back to our school. We will continue to maintain and monitor the area for wear and tear, taking action as required. We may need to consider fencing off some areas.
