NAIDOC Week

Last week we celebrated NAIDOC Week. This year's theme is 'For Our Elders', which recognises the important role elders hold in our communities and families. Students participated in a range of activities promoting cultural understanding, appreciation, and responsiveness, including listening to Dreamtime stories, learning Aboriginal symbols and Noongar words, researching Indigenous Legends and various art activities.

We also had an amazing interactive Noongar performance by the Wadumbah Noongar Dance Group. The performance brought the Dreaming stories of the very first Australians to life and they taught us a few Noongar words. The performances included traditional Aboriginal costumes, didgeridoo playing, traditional tapping sticks and they got the students up to participate in an Aboriginal dance!

Student Learning Dispositions

As part of our school's Visible Learning journey, we have worked together as a staff and community to agree on six learner dispositions. This will become embedded in the language we use at school – the plan for this semester is for these dispositions to be turned into posters, with 'I can...' statements, these will be student friendly.

- Cooperative (Working together)
- Persevere (Continue to work towards a goal, even if it is difficult to achieve)
- **Self Motivated** (Doing or achieving something because of one's own enthusiasm or interest, without needing prompting)
- Resilient (Bounce back after challenges)

NAPLAN Results

Individual Student NAPLAN reports went home to students on Friday afternoon, 21/7. Schools receive very detailed results around student performance and progress. As a school, we will be using this data to reflect on our programs and teaching, and we will then act accordingly to make adjustments that meet our student's needs.

EISA Cross Country

Next Friday, the Aveley PS Cross Country Team will be competing at the EISA Cross Country event hosted by Bullsbrook College. Forty students in Years 3 - 6 will be completing the 1.5km and 2km bush course. Students have begun training for their event on Thursday mornings.
